Richard Bushman retired from Columbia University in 2001 where he was Gouverneur Morris Professor of History. In 2008 he was appointed Howard W. Hunter Chair of Mormon Studies in the School of Religion at Claremont University where he has been teaching along with his wife Claudia Bushman. His first book "From Puritan to Yankee: Character and the Social Order in Connecticut, 1690-1765" won the Bancroft prize for 1967 and his biography "Joseph Smith: Rough Stone Rolling" won the Mormon History Association Best Book Award and the Evans prize for Mormon and Western biography. He received his Ph.D. in the History of American Civilization from Harvard. In the Church, he has served as Bishop, Stake President, and Patriarch. He and his wife Claudia are the parents of six children.
