**HON. JOHN CLIFFORD WALLACE  
SENIOR JUDGE OF THE U.S. COURT OF  
APPEALS FOR THE NINTH CIRCUIT**

The Law School is proud to inaugurate the *J. Clifford Wallace Annual Lecture Series* with an address by the series' namesake.

J. Clifford Wallace, Judge, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, is one of most recognized and influential graduates of the University of California at Berkeley's School of Law. Judge Wallace graduated from Boalt Hall in 1955, and after a decade and a half in private practice was nominated by President Richard Nixon to a federal district judgeship in the Southern District of California, receiving his commission October of 1970. Two years later he was nominated and confirmed to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, later serving as Chief Judge of the Ninth Circuit from 1991 to 1996. Judge Wallace took senior status in 1996.

In addition to his rulings on the bench, Judge Wallace is known for his focus on international affairs and development and advancing the rule of law abroad, especially through developing an independent judiciary, streamlining judicial administration, and strengthening the separation of powers. He has traveled the globe extensively to promote these principles in fledging judiciaries ranging from the South Pacific to the Middle East to China.
