Community Law Help is provided as assessment and referral service to the Hispanic and immigrant communities. This service is provided by volunteer students from the BYU Law School, and therefore is only available when the Law School is in session (from January to April

and from August to December). Consultations are provided to walk-in clients and also by appointment. The volunteer law students cannot give legal advice, but can assess legal issues and put clients in contact with attorneys who handle those issues. The volunteers also have access to a list of attorneys who have indicated they will provide pro bono legal services, and low-income clients can be put in touch directly with these attorneys.

During the Fall 2009 semester, Community Law Help is held every Wednesday 2:00-5:00 pm and 6:00-8:00 pm, and Thursday 9:00-11:00 am and 1:00-3:00 pm at Centro Hispano, 819 South 200 West, Provo. Call (801) 655-0258 for more information.

Student volunteers from the BYU Law School serve members of the public under the direction of a supervising attorney. The times this service is offered varies with the students' schedules, and thereby alters on a semester-by-semester basis.

#### **1. Elder Law Project (LIFE)**

Pro bono attorneys supervise students representing senior citizen clients. The students obtain these clients through meetings at Senior Citizen Centers in Utah Valley. Most of these cases are handled without the need for litigation. The attorney and student assist clients in a broad range of legal matters including

drafting of simple wills, living wills, health care programs, and consumer complaints. Utah Legal Services provides will-drafting software and information pamphlets for these cases. The time commitment for each case varies.

## **2. Domestic Violence Intervention**

On Tuesday evenings from 5:00-8:00, pro bono attorneys supervise students assisting victims of spousal abuse. The Pro Bono attorneys are either a Utah Legal Services attorney or Susan Griffith. Students give advice, referrals and service to those with legal questions. This clinic is located at the Family Justice Center, in the Health and Justice Building on University Ave and 100 South in Provo.

## **3. Street Law Project**

Pro bono attorneys supervise students assisting low income clients. *See* Community Legal Night, *supra*.<sup>13</sup>

## **4. Youth in Mediation Seminar**

Student volunteers from the BYU Law School conduct pro bono mediations with participants from the Juvenile Detention facilities and from the Provo School District truancy programs.

## **E. Legal Night**

**Who:** Ford & Huff LC

**When:** Monthly

**Where:** 45 East 200 North, Alpine, Utah 84004

Legal Night is an event at which attorneys offer thirty minutes of legal consultation to the public for \$45.00. Legal Night is held once a month with appointments scheduled in advance

Individuals must then follow the instructions on that page, after which a member of the Ford & Huff legal staff contacts them to set up the Legal Night appointment. The firm offers Legal Night consultations in the following areas: Divorce, Mediation, Foreclosure, DUI, Landlord Tenant, Estate Planning, Civil Litigation, IP, Business Start-up, Business Registration, Personal Injury, Wrongful Death, Labor & Employment Issues, Real Estate, and Civil Rights.

**F. Mediation: Center for Conflict Resolution**

**Who:** BYU Center for Conflict Resolution

**When:** By appointment

**Where:** 4412 WSC, BYU, Provo, UT 84602-7933

The BYU Center for Conflict Resolution (CCR) assists in resolving conflicts involving BYU students, particularly between landlords and tenants in BYU-contracted housing. The Mediation Process of the BYU Center for Conflict Resolution requires no fees—the service is free. During the mediation, neutral mediators assist the parties in negotiating disputes and working out settlement agreements. The mediators are volunteers trained to facilitate discussions and allow the parties to work out their own solution to the problem. If the mediation process fails to bring about a settlement, we have an arbitration process in which a neutral third party will hear both sides and render a legally binding decision. Arbitration is a separate process from Mediation and requires payment of fees--\$15.00 to file a claim or counterclaim.<sup>14</sup>

Small Claims Mediation is available during small claims courts in Utah County: American Fork, Orem, Provo and Spanish Fork district courts, and Provo justice court. Service is provided by trained volunteer mediators in collaboration with BYU's J. Reuben Clark Law School and with Utah Valley University. Call (801) 422-3842 for more information. Spanish speaking interpreters are available. Clinic operates late August through early May only.

### **H. Telephone-only Legal Advice**

**Who:** Utah Legal Services  
**When:** Monday through Friday  
**Where:** Utah Legal Services phone (801) 374-6766

Often, an individual's legal questions can be addressed over the phone. By calling the main number for Utah Legal Services (801-374-6766), eligible members of the public can be put directly in contact with an attorney capable of advising them in a specific area of law. The intake hours for Utah Legal Services are Monday through Friday, 9:00 am until 2:00 pm. Upon calling Utah Legal Services, members of the public will have the opportunity to select the legal problem they are facing. These legal problems are grouped by the Utah Legal Services' answering service into the following categories: domestic relations; housing; income or healthcare program; consumer law; estate planning; Native American or tribal court issues, migrant farm workers; criminal charges or traffic tickets; other legal problems.

## **I. Tuesday Night Bar**

**Who:** Central Utah Bar Association

**Where:** Various locations

**When:** First and third Tuesday of each month

The Tuesday Night Bar is a free legal advice program run by the Central Utah Bar Association (CUBA). This event is held the first and third Tuesday of each month from 6:00-8:00 pm; each event lasts approximately two to three hours. At Tuesday Night Bar, free legal consultations are provided to the public by appointment only; walk-ins are not permitted. The purpose of this program is to assist the public in determining their legal rights.

Attorneys are scheduled for a particular evening and show up that evening. Each client is allowed twenty minutes to ask the volunteer attorney questions about their particular legal problem. The volunteer attorney does not enter into an attorney/client relationship at that meeting. Primarily the volunteer acts as a referral source, letting clients know of their legal rights and referring them to private attorneys or legal service agencies. Volunteers are given a handout which outlines their duties for the evening and gives a list a referral sources.<sup>15</sup>

Individuals seeking help can make appointments for the Tuesday Night Bar by calling the Brigham Young University Law Help Desk at (801) 422-3025. Appointments should be made one week before the clinic. Any messages left are returned daily during the school year, and weekly during the summer months.

On the first Tuesday of the month, Tuesday Night Bar is held at Brigham Young University. On the third Tuesday of the month, Tuesday Night Bar is held at a local law
